

Arizona Golden Rescue is, indeed, fortunate to have some very generous supporters — many from within the organization and some from the community. I specifically want to thank those who have set up a monthly donation, either with their bank's bill-pay option, or with PayPal or Zelle. These folks are listed on page 27. Their donations range from \$5 per month (for a total of \$60 per year — adds up, doesn't it? Would you miss \$5 per month? How about \$10 per month? How about \$25, etc?) — to \$200 per month (\$2,400 per year!). It is comforting to know that every month, no matter what other sporadic donations come in, we are sure to receive \$796.

A few members donate monthly through a payroll plan at their workplace. These donations come to us via *American Online Giving Foundation* (Benevity Causes Portal), *Charities Aid Foundation*, and *Nationwide* and the *Nationwide Foundation*. One *AGR* member who works for *JP Morgan Chase* bank takes advantage of semi-regular offerings of matching funds from the bank for their donation to a charity (*AGR*). Does your workplace offer an automatic payroll-deduction and/or a matching funds program? Please ask the human resources person at your workplace.

Everyone shops for groceries, and many of us regularly shop at a *Fry's* (*Kroger*) *Food Store* or *Fry's Marketplace*. If you do, and you do not currently have a *Fry's* VIP account, please go to Customer Service the next time you're in the store and get one set up with *AGR* as your beneficiary. Not only will you be contributing a small percentage of your grocery bill to *Arizona Golden Rescue* (at no extra charge to you), you will also be the recipient of weekly digital deals (coupons available online) that are automatically applied to your total charge. Depending on what you buy, the savings can really add up – you and *AGR* both win in the process. We get a quarterly check from *Fry's Community Partners* program which is usually around \$455.

In the market for a new house or car? If you have your mortgage or title handled by *Great American Title Company*, we will get a donation through their *Community Outreach* program.

One other business I want to thank is *Baldwin Moffitt Behm LLC*, 8399 E Indian School Road #201, Scottsdale, AZ 85251 480-736-9200. For the past two years, this company has graciously donated their service in preparing our tax return for the IRS. We do not pay tax, but we must file a tax return in order to maintain our 501 (c) (3) status. All non-profits are now required to file electronically, so we have to hire someone who is licensed to file, as we cannot

get such a license. The filing fee is \$250. Cindy Tigges (primarily) and I prepare a preliminary return and we have our Quickbooks account that Cindy has kept up for many years. But the final return (the long 990 form, no less) has been done *pro bono* by Travis Nelson at *BMB*. We sincerely thank this company for their generosity, as their service would probably cost well over \$1,000.

We are often the beneficiary of grants from *Colorado Animal Rescue Express* (*C.A.R.E.*), *The Golden Retriever Foundation* and *PACC911*. Quite a few years ago, Rebecca Mackerman made the contact with *C.A.R.E.* when she was sleuthing grant-giving organizations online (there aren't many that will donate to a relatively small single-breed-with-Golden-mixes Rescue). *C.A.R.E.* has been enhancing the animal welfare community for over 18 years. We have been fortunate to be the recipients of grants from their *Jake's Fund*, most recently to help with expenses for 24-045 Spam, 24-088 Mac and 25-005 Katana. *C.A.R.E.* cares!

Jolene Schlichter is our liaison with *The Golden Retriever Foundation*. She prepares grant applications, which need to include vet invoices and photos of the dog, for rescued purebred Goldens that have had extraordinary medical expenses. The *GRF* will donate \$800 per dog. Recently, we received such help for 24-045 Spam, 24-075 Bear, 24-088 Mac and 25-006 Chloe.

Our local PACC911 will help financially with "ordinary" expenses such as spays/neuters, standard veterinary exams and some treatments, as well as with behavior assessments and modification training, and also with extraordinary expenses for rescued dogs such as surgeries and emergency room visits. There are currently almost 150 local animal rescue organizations that are under the umbrella of PACC911. In the May issue of The Golden Paw (now available on our website's NEWS tab), I reviewed the various ways PACC911 helps community Rescue organizations. This organization does some incredible fundraising. Their major fundraiser, "Glimmer of Hope", is coming up in November. Valley Toyota dealers have donated a Toyota 4runner SR5 for PACC911 to raffle off. Tickets are \$100 each or three for \$250. If you would like to take a chance on winning this vehicle, go to https://pacc911.org/glimmer-of-hope-car-raffle. Since only 2000 tickets have been printed, you have a 1:2000 chance to win the car (or \$25,000 in cash), which is a far better chance than with any available lottery!

Community Business Partners.

In June, we had over 60 members and friends join us for a very fun *Bingo Night* at *Charley's Place* in Glendale. We have already been asked to come again, and we will – in June 2026. Although it was a no-dog event, it was a really fun indoor activity. Our thanks to Denise Padavano and Jeanne Wegener for making the contact with *Charley's Place* and organizing our participation.

As a result of a contact made by Jeanne Wegener in the summer of 2024, we have recently partnered with *Chicken N Pickle*, Glendale, and had a very successful fun-and fundraiser there. Please read Denise's article on pages 20-25.

Last year for the first time, we partnered with *Pavilion Art Gallery* in Scottsdale, and had an exceptional *Wine Tasting and Dessert* event. We will be doing a similar event this year on September 21st, but this time, we will have appetizers as well as desserts, along with some very excellent wine for attendees to try. Registration must be done on our website. Please plan to come!

AGR has a connection with two restaurants that donate a percentage of food sales if we have an event at the restaurant: Paulie's Little Bite of Italy in Sun City, where we host Dine Out With The Dogs on the last Sunday of October, and P. F. Chang's on Happy Valley Road in Phoenix. Denise and Jeanne made the original contact for a donation when they were "eating their way across the Valley." Cody Lewien, the Senior Managing Partner of P. F. Chang's, took a liking to AGR and has been incredibly supportive ever since. This year, we will be hosting Chopsticks With The Dogs at the Happy Valley restaurant on November 21st; we will have our Dog Ornament Christmas Tree up in their lobby by then.

Veterinary Partners.

AGR uses several veterinary practices in locations around the Valley, as well as some vets in outlying areas like Flagstaff, Lake Havasu, Prescott, Tucson, Sierra Vista and others. The vets we use all give Rescue a discount on their services (only for dogs whose adoption is not yet finalized), without which we would not be able to care for as many dogs as well as we do. We thank all of them for their generosity and encourage you to use these vets.

What's Up, DOC?

AGR lost a very special volunteer, Rick Rogers, who passed away on May 29, 2025, after several months of battling health conditions. I don't intend this to be melancholy, but I want to pay tribute to what Rick did for us and how special he was to me. Rick and his wife, Jeanine, and son, Cameron, joined AGR just a year earlier in May 2024. Soon thereafter, they became fosters for a special needs dog, 24-033 Fozzi. When Fozzi was delivered to them on 7/12/2024 by transporter Connie McCabe, Deb Orwig and I rode along with Connie, as we all wanted to meet this family. When their home evaluation was done in early June, Rick mentioned he was eager to help with our website due to his experience, and I was thrilled and thankful to meet and work with him! In the weeks and months that followed, Rick was a huge help to me and to AGR with countless improvements to our website, including: menu improvements, added various new pages for News, Rainbow Bridge dogs, Pending Adoption dogs, Board of Directors, a Newsletter Index page to link specific past articles, ensured all older Golden Paw newsletters were available, a Volunteer Opportunities page, and a Foster Process page. In October 2024, Rick worked diligently to develop our Home Evaluation process as an online form within our database. Rick was an absolute joy to work with, always so calm and pleasant, and he personally taught me a lot about how to maintain the website. I am grateful to have known this man for the short one-year period he was with AGR, and I will truly miss him! Thankfully, Jeanine has become an increasingly active volunteer with AGR, as she helps with events, home evaluations, and recently agreed to join the Intake team. And, Fozzi's adoption (read his story on page 11) has been finalized with Jeanine and Cameron!

Here are some general statistics of AGR operations for the first six months of 2025 through 6/30/2025:

44 total Intake dogs (17 males, 27 females)

26 under two years old

11 are 3-5 years old

6 are 6-8 years old

1 is over 12 years old

Breed: 22 are purebred Goldens, 22 are Golden mixes Status:

23 have been adopted and finalized

7 are with a FWITA pending adoption

2 were euthanized for medical reasons

4 are available for adoption

4 are with fosters under observation

4 are in veterinary boarding awaiting medical

Submitted forms for first six months 2025 through 6/30/2025:

425 total forms submitted:

- 164 Adoption applications
- 115 Home Evaluations completed
- 75 Membership applications
- 9 Pickleball registrations
- 53 Surrender Inquiries (from people wanting to surrender dogs)
- 9 Contact Us forms (from people wanting general information)

All of these online forms necessitate responses, and we have a team of volunteers who do them. Deb Orwig processes Adoption and Membership Applications until the fee is paid. After fee payment is received, she sends Adoption Applications to Sheila Joyce, our Home Evaluations Coordinator, who assigns the HE to a Team member. Once the HE is completed, Sheila makes the decision to approve the applicant, require some fix-ups, or deny the applicant. Deb sends paid Membership Applications to Membership Manager Sandra Hansen, who updates the membership section of our database.

Since I was taught by Rick Rogers how to create online registration forms for events, I have done that for the *Pickleball Tournament* and for our upcoming *Wine Tasting* event. Deb Orwig keeps track of payments for registrations and sends the registrations to Jeanne Wegener, who then acts as Registrar for the event.

Surrender Inquiries are dealt with by Intake Co-Manager, Sharon Flores. She calls the owner of the dog, does an initial interview to determine if the dog is aggressive and requests that photos of the dog be sent. Sometimes she consults with an *AGR* Board member for their opinion, especially if the dog is a mix. Once a surrender is approved, the Intake Team member "on duty" for the week takes over and does an extensive interview (Intake Profile). The Intake Team member then notifies the Transport Team that a dog needs to be picked up and the Placement Manager, Keri Marchant, that a new dog will need a home.

Deb Orwig addresses the Contact Us forms and determines who needs to respond – usually herself, sometimes Kathy Blue, sometimes Sharon Flores.

Jeanne Wegener and I took a field trip to both locations to investigate the feasibility of a possible fundraiser. Our new event took place in June 2025 with 62 family, friends and *AGR* members in attendance (read about it on page 19)!

Our other summer event, an indoor pickleball tournament, "Score for the Goldens," took place at *Chicken N Pickle* in Glendale on August 3, 2025. This event came about by Jeanne Wegener asking for a donation in the summer of 2024. Hosting many fundraisers and being a dog lover, the facility's coordinator offered to hold a tournament at *Chicken N Pickle* for *AGR*, with no charge for four courts. How could we resist trying something new and different?

Wanting to give back to the community, business owners and managers have offered their venues for no charge to *AGR*. In 2024, the owner of the *Pavilion Art Gallery* in Scottsdale, Jon Wendell, approached *AGR's* booth during the *Parada de Sol and Trail's End Festival*, wanting to do something for the community. He offered to host an event at his gallery. We were very excited to present a new event in Scottsdale in the fall of 2024, "Celebrate Fine Art, Wine & Dessert". The event was fun and successful, and the owner has agreed to host another one this September 21, 2025!

Meet our new Co-Directors for Health Care: ensuring the well-being of our beloved Goldens

We are thrilled to be a part of the Health Care Team of *Arizona Golden Rescue*! As Co-Directors, we are partnering with Liz Tataseo to learn our duties and benefit from her years of experience! Amazing! We are excited to continue *AGR*'s mission to provide the best care and health management to ensure our furry friends live long, happy, and healthy lives, as well as providing support and information for our adoptive families.

While you might think that as Co-Directors for health care we have a wealth of knowledge, we must admit our experience comes just from being long-term Golden owners. Our first Golden, **Rio**, was the alpha in our household and remained healthy until he passed with an enlarged heart. **Mesa** succumbed to leukemia, **Co-**

rona to a twisted intestine, and Rodeo lived to the age of sixteen.

We now have **Makena**, **Cruz**, and our adopted pup, **Kai**. The first two have had the typical ear infections, Giardia, piece of wood stuck in his mouth and crazy over the top energy, but **Kai** – well this is where **AGR** comes in.

Constantly looking for an addition to our family, we needed a low-key pup that could behave while visiting our elderly mother, as well as handle two big dogs as "siblings." Researching AGR's website, we came across Kai's photo and description outlining his need for both hips to be replaced. Since the siblings were still in Washington with Garrett, we decided to submit an application knowing our home was able to accommodate Kai's recovery time and needs. What a love! When Connie brought him to our home, he was a bit shy but settled right in. It was difficult to tell that his hips were so bad the way he ran the yard and would swim in the pool. And then the work began!

Liz Tataseo, Connie McCabe, and Teri Guilbault (her pup was having her second hip done at the same time as **Kai's** first) were instrumental through the entire process. (Both times – 6 months for the first hip and 6 months later for the second hip.) So, here we are today — our role is to ensure that the dogs that come into the Rescue are properly vetted and their medical needs are understood before they are placed into foster care and eventually adopted. And once a dog is adopted, the new owners will have the support and access to continue to meet their new canine family member's needs to live a full, happy, healthy life.

We are lucky to have Amy Maynard and Teri Guilbault as our Vet Liaisons to FWITAs and collaborating with veterinarians. Plus, our Microchip Manager Sandra Hansen helps track our fosters. We are excited to be working with a Board of Directors that has the best intentions to help provide the best care for our rescues.

In a nutshell – now that you know who we are, know we are here to help!

- Oversee all health-related aspects, from initial vetting and routine check-ups to specialized treatments, prior to final adoption, with support from the Vet Liaisons and adopters, of course!
- Finalize adoptions and provide records for the dog.
- Always be available to answer questions, and if we do not have the immediate answer, we will use our resources and tap the wealth of knowledge of those that have been doing this for an extraordinarily long time!

Thank you for your support and dedication to AGR, and for allowing us this opportunity to be a part of this organization. We look forward to sharing more updates and success stories with you in the coming months.

Home evaluators will preferably have a dog-friendly dog they can take with them to home visits. Transporters will need a suitable vehicle

to transport dog(s) and crates, preferably a mid-to-large SUV or van. Placement and Intake volunteers are able to do their assignments at home and require being very comfortable communicating with people via phone and text. They also will be entering information into the database and will receive training for that.

Summer Fundraiser for Special Needs Dogs

In most previous summers, I have done a mailing to all adopters in which I made a plea to "pay it forward." AGR paid \$\$\$, and in some cases, \$\$\$\$, to ensure your dog was as healthy as possible before we placed the dog with you. Now it is time for you to consider making a donation to help AGR help more dogs to the best and healthiest life possible. Due to my involvement with four fundraisers – one in June and the three coming up in August, September, and October – I have not had time to prepare the mailing this year. So, I want to say to all of you adopters: PLEASE SEND A DONATION! All donations that come in during August and September will be considered as supporting our Special Needs Dogs – these are all the dogs that have been featured in the Diamonds In The Ruff column in the November 2024, February 2025, May 2025 and this current issue, August 2025. If you have not kept your hard copy of these issues, you can review them on our website under the NEWS tab. We have spent almost \$130,000 on these 23 dogs! We recently rescued a pair that both needed gastrointestinal surgery because they had ingested rocks. Both will need hip replacement surgery – the male will need both hips done; the female may need just one. The last dog we had one hip replacement done on cost us almost \$12,000. Do the math – please send a donation!

Belle, a young Pyrenees/Golden mix, is playful, affectionate and friendly with people and dogs. She will chase cats, although she has not hurt them. She gets along with older children, but she is so tall and boisterous that she could accidentally knock over a small child. She does need obedience training but walks pretty well on a leash. Belle loves to dig and bury her bones and toys in the backyard, so a dog door or

unsupervised yard access is not a good idea.

Belle does not like to be crated, so a home where people are not gone all day is best for her. She requires a 6 ft wall and good-sized yard. Belle needs exercise to work off some of that puppy enthusiasm - leash walking will not be enough. She loves to play with other dogs, but is protective of her food and treats, so supervision will be needed and she would be happy living as a single dog.

Ruff is a small, neutered Golden mix that was found as a stray. He was thin and had some skin wounds, but allowed the finder to give him a bath. He didn't like being handled at first, and the finder noticed Ruff was fearful of shoes or raised hands. While he has been in boarding he has learned to happily play and roughhouse with the kennel staff. He is crate-trained (with



some coaxing), leash-trained, and loves his walks. We were told he was house-trained, but he might need some positive reinforcement with that.

Ruff is friendly and gets along well with other dogs. Because he plays rough and may be reactive to being touched in certain areas, we will not adopt Ruff to a home with small children.



Indi is a beautiful four-year-old spayed Goldendoodle. She is very athletic and needs room to run and play. She is leash-trained, crate-trained, and house-trained. In addition to having worked with a prescription of the place of the place

could easily be an only dog. She is very affectionate and is looking forward to a new home.

Indi comes with several pre-paid training sessions with the behaviorist/trainer who knows her well.

Spam at Intake

24-045 Spam was rescued in early July 2024 as a then 14-week-old purebred female puppy in need of medical attention. *Veterinary Emergency Group* in Chandler contacted *AGR* as they had this puppy with neurological symptoms which the original owner surrendered to the ER vet. After evaluation by *AMSC* in Scottsdale with a CT of her abdomen, echocardiogram, and ammonia test, it was dis-

covered she has an internal liver shunt, a vascular anomaly which is congenital. The abnormal vessels allow normal blood, which drains from the digestive system, to bypass the liver (where it would usually be detoxified) and flow directly into the systemic circulation. This condition results in an underdeveloped liver, a deficient protein supply, and abnormal fat and protein metabolism. Spam was too young at the time and her vessels were still growing, so surgery to repair this could not be done until she was approximately 5-6 months old. In mid-December 2024, Spam had a procedure called intrahepatic coil embolization, which essentially meant they inserted various coils as a "stent cave" to open up the vessels, hoping her liver will work properly. She was faithfully fostered for 11 months by AGR volunteer Sharon, who ensured Spam got all her meds on schedule with food and increasing dosages as Spam matured. Amazingly, in April 2025, the veterinarian who started Spam on her medical journey last July,

saw **Spam** at *VEG* for a urinary tract infection, so she applied with a request to adopt her. In early June 2025, **Spam** was welcomed into her new home with Kelsey and Michael in Tempe. **Spam's** vet expenses for 2024 cost *AGR* \$19,861, and second quarter 2025 totaled \$2,813. **Spam's** total expenses so far have amounted to \$24,565, but she still needs to be spayed. She is now doing well.

24-055 Indi is a 4½-year-old spayed female Goldendoodle who is now placed (see ad on page 9)! She was originally rescued by *AGR* in 2023 but then returned to *AGR* in late July 2024 due to some behavior issues, plus the adopters made frequent travels. In the past many months, **Indi** has been in boarding and on fluoxetine, which has helped to keep her quite calm. **Indi** has also spent time

in training with behaviorist Sharon, who reports that **Indi** is very motivated by human attention, is well-mannered, and would be fine in a home with another dog that is generally calm and perhaps older, though **Indi** does not need that companionship. She is a sweet girl and good size at only 50 lbs. Let's find this girl a forever home! **Indi's** second-quarter expenses were \$2,217, and total expenses since her July 2024 intake are \$5,152.

25-011 Oliver came into *AGR* in late January 2025 as a 6½-year-old unneutered male purebred Golden Retriever. He was surrendered by his prior family with young children due to time and financial constraints. Oliver is loving and sweet but suffers from chronic ear and skin infections. He had all his initial vetting done in February, was brought up to date on vaccinations, and

placed on meds for low thyroid and a slightly-inflated valley fever titer. In early April, **Oliver** found his forever home with adopters Mike and Lew in Scottsdale, who had just lost their beloved older Golden and fell in love with sweet **Oliver** immediately. **Ollie**, as he is now known, was neutered in mid-April and all is going quite well! His expenses for second quarter were \$2,252.

25-034 Sol and 25-035 Luna are a male/female pair of purebred 1½-year-old neutered/spayed Golden Retrievers surrendered by their prior owner due to lack of time for them. When our transporter picked them up, she noted they were the dirtiest, stinkiest, most severely-matted dogs she had seen in many years. Both dogs' coats needed to be shaved down due to the matting.

Also, it was discovered both dogs had ingested rocks in their digestive system, and both dogs will require future hip surgery due to shallow hip sockets. **Sol** and **Luna** both had surgery on June 3rd for foreign body removal of the ingested rocks; **Luna** was able to be placed in a foster home on June 11th. **Sol** had to remain in boarding at the vet due to some infection with his incision; he was released on June 27th. **Sol** and **Luna** are again together in the same home, being lovingly fostered by Dewayne and Dori in Sun City West, who hopefully will see them through their upcoming hip surgeries whenever those might be scheduled. Total 2025 costs for **Sol** so far have been **\$3,700**, and **Luna's** expense is **\$2,789**. Note that their expenses will rise dramatically when they have the hip surgeries they require.

Magic Moments... when a stray Golden Retriever or Golden mix is spotted in a shelter kennel and does a happy dance when taken out; when a neglected backyard dog is surrendered by its owner to a member of our Transport Team and is delivered to a foster family that shows the dog love, comfort, toys and good-quality food for, perhaps, the first time in the dog's life; and the most magical of all... when a rescued dog meets his or her forever family and we see the dog's excitement and the sparkle in the family's eyes. As rescuers, we are privileged to share in these Magic Moments. Below are stories of Arizona Golden Rescue's Magic Moments from April 16, 2025 through July 15, 2025. All adoptions finalized after July 15th will be in the next issue.



24-033 Fozzi is a 4-year-old male Golden mix who was found wandering in the desert. Being a stray, there was no background information on Fozzi; one thing for certain was that he was terribly frightened. He would need time to adjust to new surroundings for him to feel secure and safe. Through every step of the process, from intaking a dog to finding a for-

ever home, AGR with its village of passionate and caring people, has provided this for Fozzi. Now in his new home, Fozzi is becoming himself! He is finding joy each day as he knows he has the unconditional love of Jeanine and Cameron. Fozzi's story is one of triumph-over-struggle! Let Jeanine be the storyteller of how Fozzi wagged his tale into their hearts! Wow! It has been almost a year since we first met our Fozzi Bear! Time has gone by so quickly! From what we know, Fozzi was abandoned at the Salt River



and had been on his own for a while. Many people reported him and the H.A.R.T.T. Team finally was able to trap him; they connected Fozzi with Arizona Golden Rescue. Once trapped, Fozzi was transported to AW for evaluation and decompression. Fozzi had a burst eardrum, a damaged eye, was full of foxtails, and was

beyond terrified of everyone and everything. When we agreed to

foster Fozzi, we knew we had a long road ahead of us. Since he was so scared, we couldn't get near him, and we worried he would get away from us even though we were being super careful. I decided that the best way to get him more comfortable with us, was to tether him to myself, 24/7! I started with three leashes so he felt a bit safer not having to be too close to me; eventually I removed a leash so he had to be closer and I could touch him. It took about four days, of constantly being tethered, before he allowed more pets, got used to the household noise and activity, and started to be less ready to flee. Notice I didn't say he got comfortable! He wasn't! He was just a tad less terrified. Those first few weeks were challenging, and that is when Rick, Cameron and I decided that we needed to adopt Fozzi; we felt that he just wouldn't be able to handle moving from home to home. Now, almost a year later, Fozzi is actually happier and brighter! When we got him, he didn't play with anything, and would barely take a treat. Now he gets his pile of toys together and takes a nap on them! He loves to pounce and bounce! He is still anxious about many things, like when we open the microwave or put on the kitchen fan, but we feel that he will slowly come to understand that he is truly safe and loved. At our vet, Ellie received protection from Bordetella and canine influenza, as well a Cytopoint injection to help with her allergies. She tested negative for heartworm and weak-positive (titer 1:2) for valley fever. She will need a recheck for valley fever in three months. Transporter Connie, who delivered Ellie to Mary in Peoria, reported: Ellie is very pretty with long straight hair that will need lots of combing to keep from tangling. She was nervous and skittish when we arrived at Mary's and she did not trust either of us. I let her off-leash in the yard to relieve herself after the ride and then she ran around and would not come back to us. The dogsitter did mention that might be the case. We

tried to coax Ellie into the house with cheese, but she bolted every time we got near. So, I went outside and steered her towards the door. She eventually ran back into the house and jumped onto the couch, where she remained the whole time I was there. After only a day, Mary related to Connie that Ellie was less skittish. Recently, Mary sent these comments: She is a sweet young lady. She likes to snuggle on the bed and the couch. I was watching my neighbor's dog and Ellie got along great with him. She did try to block the dog from getting close to me, though - already a little protective. She likes her balls. She bounces when she gets the ball and brings it back to me. The only thing I've been working on with her is her barking. She barks at everything. I have made progress with this. I give her treats when she stops barking. She was barking very early in the morning. I would get up and call her in – she isn't barking early in the morning anymore. Overall, she is a wellbehaved, happy young lady, and I already love her. We bet she loves you, too. Thanks for adopting her.

Mind Games Dogs Play with Humans

You have been seen, and when you and your special friend meet, you take him or her in your arms and embrace.


Your face is kissed again and again and again, and you look once more into the eyes of your trusting pet.

Then you cross the Rainbow Bridge together, never again to be separated.




