Chang's**, *Giving Tuesday*, **Phoenix Legacy Foundation's Holiday Adopt-a-thon** at **Sam's Club**, *Gift Wrapping* at **Floor & Decor Prasada**, *Photos with Santa* at **O.H.S.O Prasada**, and the *Matching Funds Challenge*. We did well with all of them. The *Matching Funds Challenge* issued by Jeannette and David Morrocco (thank you so much!) was especially lucrative: **\$23,453!** This money ensures that **25-060 Zazzy** will get his legs fixed (read **Zazzy's** story on page 10). Thank you all so much for your support!

Sharon Flores



Over many years, Sharon has done a lot for **Arizona Golden Rescue**. She asserts that Rescue saved her from falling into a pit of depression after she lost her daughter-in-law, her husband and her mother within a short time, but she is one who has saved Rescue in many ways.

She adopted a dog from us: **13-044 Honey**. She brought **Honey** to numerous events, met some of our more active members and decided she wanted to get more involved. In 2018, she offered to answer the **AGR** telephone, which we call the **WAGSline** (623-566-WAGS), and has been doing that seven days a week ever since – we have gotten countless positive comments about our phone being answered by a person!

After **Honey** passed away, Sharon started fostering and accumulated a total of 27 different dogs; some stayed with her for just days, others for months. Many were medically needy – several had parvo (all survived); one had a weird kind of Giardia that required special meds; one had to have two surgeries and some rare medication that had to be given on a strict schedule; one had heartworm and disseminated valley fever and was sick for months; recently she fostered **24-045 Spam** from puppy to adulthood – she needed a special kind of surgery (liver shunt) and stayed with Sharon for almost a year.

In 2019, Sharon took a break from fostering for three years. She adopted a bonded pair of 12-year-old dogs, **19-081 Riley** and **19-082 Cassie**, when their adoptive owner died suddenly; she kept them going until they were over 15. She joined the Intake Team and, eventually, became Co-Manager with Judy Petitto. She worked closely with Debbie Ball to get the Intake section of the *Policies & Procedures Manual* in order. She has done much database work; she has helped check up on approved adopters who have not had a dog placed with them in a year to determine if they still want to be on our waiting list. She has also done many home evaluations remotely by Facetime, and has done transports, as well. I cannot sing enough praises of Sharon and all she has done for **AGR!**

Now getting older, she has moved to Montana to be closer to her daughter and son-in-law, who have lived there for years. We may be losing her physical presence, but we are not losing her as an active volunteer! She says she will continue to do everything she was doing by phone, text and email, except that she will not be able to foster, as it would be a bit far for Transport to take a dog!

Our sincere thanks to Sharon Flores for her service to **AGR** for 13 years and for continuing to support us in whatever way she can for as long as she can.

About Volunteering

Our Director of Activities, Denise Padavano, does a great job soliciting volunteers to help at events. Although we could use more without Denise having to work so hard to encourage participation, it is not just those one-time or even multiple-times volunteers that we could use. It is what I call “core volunteers”: those members who do day-to-day or weekly jobs that oil the Rescue wheel.

When you look at all that our Board, Team Managers and Team volunteers accomplish, you may think, “Oh, I could never do any of those jobs.” You’re probably wrong. We all started out knowing little about the job we offered to do. Over time, both the job and the individual doing it have evolved and become better.

We have a terrific mentoring system, and Debbie Ball has compiled an excellent *Policies & Procedures Manual* with details about any job you might consider doing. The *Manual* is always a work in progress and updated as needed; any procedures you might need to use are written in an easy-to-follow, step-by-step outline form. You’ll never be expected to know everything there is to know about a job right from the get-go. We will train you!

We need a member with some accounting background to work with our Organization Accountant, Cindy Tigges, to learn the ins and outs of our Quickbooks system. It would be wonderful if the

person is already familiar with Quickbooks. In Cindy's words: *What I would like is for someone to review my notes with me on the accounting process for AGR to make sure they are accurate and understandable for anyone needing to use QB in the future. That would mean a trip to my house and to sit with me and follow my notes, while I show-and-tell my data entry and reconciliations process. One time only gig.*

Other calls that need to be made are to adopters whom we have not heard from since adoption was finalized, especially to those who adopted more than a few years ago, to ask if the dog they adopted is still with them and how she or he is doing.

We need members willing to write thank you letters for donations. You will be given a template, stationery and postage, so the only thing you need to provide is time.

We could always use more home evaluators in all parts of the Valley, especially some with dog-friendly dogs who are willing to take their dog to the home of an applicant who has a resident dog.

If you are willing to commit to volunteering for a few hours a week or a month, please contact me or Debbie Ball or Connie McCabe.



What's Up, DOC?

Part of my duties as Director of Operations is to manage the database to ensure accurate documentation and that our various procedures are being implemented. I thrive on statistics which I have compiled below. Since 2025 is now finished, here is a summary of our rescue dog statistics for the year, plus our Submitted Forms, and some income percentages. All information is as of 12/31/25.

A total of 73 dogs were rescued by **AGR** in 2025, which is somewhat fewer than our typical 90-dogs-average based on our previous 10 years of operation.

2 shelter dogs

The Human Connection

"It's all about the dogs"

We say that a lot, because that is why we are all part of this wonderful group. You would not be reading this if it were not for your love for the dogs. But as much as that is true, it takes a lot of hard work from a lot of people to keep this organization, and therefore the dogs, alive and thriving.

So, since this is the "Human Connection" column, in every issue I am going to continue to mention a few interesting facts and stories about one or more of the people you should know. Hopefully you will learn something about them and gain more insight into how they got here. I know there are a lot of people who just wanted to adopt a dog and have no interest in participating in **AGR** activities. I will respect the privacy of those who prefer not to be active and just concentrate on those who are, or have been, most active in the organization.

Hopefully by now you will have noticed that many of our members have remained as part of the organization long after their first-year membership has expired. And, many times, even after the **AGR** dog(s) they have adopted are at the Bridge. There are many members who have never adopted a dog from us and some who don't even have a dog at all! We are grateful to those who have continued to renew their memberships year after year and who contribute their time, money, and hearts to the group, whether or not they are interested in adopting a Golden.

This quarter I'd like to feature some thoughts from our very important Placement Team – Keri Marchant and Katherine "Kat" Feltmann.



Keri has been serving on the Placement Team since fall 2021 and Team Chairman since summer 2023

*Serving on the **AGR** Placement Team is a position that encompasses both challenges and rewards. Each team member feels compassion for each dog entering our Rescue, recognizing the various circumstances that lead to their arrival. Among other reasons, dogs may come to **AGR** due to owners relocating out of state; financial limitations preventing ongoing veterinary care; illnesses such as parvo or other medical concerns; injuries like broken bones; the declining health or passing of an owner.*



Kat joined the Placement Team in summer 2025

Effective communication between Placement and other teams is essential for smooth operations. Placement Team members must be adept at reviewing substantial amounts of information – adoption applications, home evaluations, and database journal entries – to make well-informed recommendations regarding placements. Success in Placement requires strong communication, research abilities, and sound judgment. While applicants may have specific preferences, the Placement Team is responsible for asking critical questions and always prioritizing the welfare of the dogs. Ultimately, we strive to find the best fit for each dog.

Each dog's progress is tracked through "Journal Entries" or notes within our database. We reach out to pre-approved applicants via email, text, or phone, documenting all interactions and responses received, which can include requests to pause applications due to personal schedules, vacations, family changes, or interest in facilitating introductions with existing pets.

*There is a constant need for foster families or households throughout the year. When a foster home isn't immediately available, our dogs must stay in kennels at the primary veterinary office, which increases costs for **AGR** and may affect the dogs' well-being. Opening your home to a dog for even a week or several months benefits the dog's welfare and allows us to learn more about their personality during their stay.*

*Recently, I fostered **Zelda**, a senior Golden Retriever, overnight before her transition to a longer-term foster home. She was a pleasure to care for, and she will soon join an approved applicant who will provide her with a supportive and loving environment. Our foster families always have first option to proceed with adopting (foster with intent to adopt) the dog they foster.*

The Placement Team is not currently looking to add more members, but when you renew your membership, please note if you are interested in joining this Team in the future.

In the meantime, if you have any time to spare... we really need some help on the Fundraising Team to gather donations and sponsorships for our upcoming events – especially the *Fore! **Oh, No! My Dog Has Diarrhea—What Now?**

Diarrhea is one of those things almost every dog owner deals with at some point. Whether you've just brought home a new pup, your longtime companion ate something weird, or your dog picked up a bug or parasite, loose stools happen. Most of the time, it's nothing to panic about, but it's good to know what to watch for and when to take action. Never hesitate to reach out—nobody knows your dog better than you do.

This guide will help you figure out what could be causing your dog's tummy troubles and what you can do to help.

Step 1: Don't Freak Out—It's Super Common

Dogs get diarrhea for all sorts of reasons. Just one loose poop usually isn't a big deal. For now, keep an eye on your pup, clean up after them, and see if it keeps happening.

Step 2: Why Dogs Get Diarrhea

1. Stress or Changes in Routine – Travel, moving, new faces, or even just excitement can upset your dog's stomach.

What you might notice: You may see softer stools, mild diarrhea, but your dog's energy and appetite are usually normal.

What you can do: Stick to regular mealtimes, make sure your dog has lots of fresh water, and keep an eye on things for a day or two.

2. Sudden Diet Changes or Food Sensitivities – Switching up food or treats too quickly can throw off your dog's digestion.

What you might notice: Loose stool after changing food, some gas, or mild belly discomfort.

What you can do: Switch foods gradually over 5–7 days, don't give table scraps, and offer plain, gentle food if your vet recommends it.

3. Parasites (like Giardia, roundworms, and others) – Dogs

For years, **AGR** has recommended the "diarrhea diet" for dogs experiencing loose stools. This diet consists of boiled hamburger (preferably 93% lean with fat skimmed off) and boiled white potatoes, using equal amounts of each. If diarrhea continues, try adding canned pumpkin (not pumpkin pie filling) to your dog's meals. If loose stools persist, it's best to make a vet appointment and have your dog's stool tested.

that have been in shelters, around lots of other dogs, or outdoors a lot can pick up parasites.

What you might notice: Watery or recurring diarrhea, weight loss (especially in puppies), and no improvement after basic deworming.

What you can do: Keep your dog's area clean, wash your hands after picking up poop, and call your vet if diarrhea sticks around for more than two days.

4. Bacterial Infections – Sometimes dogs pick up bacteria like Salmonella, E. coli, or Campylobacter.

What you might notice: Mucus or jelly-like poop, sometimes blood in the stool, and possibly fever or a sore tummy.

What you can do: Wash food and water bowls and bedding every day, don't feed raw meat diets, and call your vet if symptoms don't clear up after two days.

5. Parvovirus (Really Serious) – A dangerous virus, especially for puppies and dogs who aren't vaccinated.

Warning signs: Vomiting, bloody or super-stinky diarrhea, very tired with low energy, refusing food, and getting dehydrated fast.

What you must do: Get to the vet right away and keep your dog away from other pets to avoid spreading the virus.

Step 3: Quick Guide – What's Going On?

If you notice... It could be... What to do

Mild diarrhea, acting normal otherwise... stress or a food switch... just watch them for 24–48 hours

Watery or keeps coming back... parasites... call the vet if it goes on longer than 2 days

Mucus or jelly-like poop... bacterial or viral infection...

contact the vet if it lasts more than 2 days

Vomiting plus bloody diarrhea... PARVO... Get to the vet now!

Step 4: Keep Everything Clean

Wash your hands after picking up poop, clean food and water bowls, crates, and bedding every day, pick up poop right away, keep sick pups away from other pets, and ask your vet which disinfectants to use.

Step 5: When to Call the Vet

Reach out to your veterinarian if diarrhea lasts longer than 48 hours, there's blood in your dog's poop, your dog is throwing up and has diarrhea, your dog seems tired, stops eating, or is dehydrated, or if you're worried or just not sure what to do.

One Last Thing

Diarrhea is common and usually clears up fast. Just pay attention to how your dog's acting, eating, and drinking so you can spot if something's wrong. With a little TLC and some watchful eyes, most dogs are back to their happy selves in no time.

Diamonds in the Ruff

Diamonds in the Ruff are dogs on which **AGR** has had to spend at least \$2,000. In the fourth quarter of 2025, we had 11 dogs that met this benchmark. Please consider donating to help with the expenses of a specific dog or just earmark it for *Diamonds in the Ruff*. All donations are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law, of course, and will be acknowledged as such.



22-007 TK came into Rescue in January 2022 as a 6-year-old male purebred Golden. He had been diagnosed with valley fever in 2021, but his prior owners stopped giving him medication – they said they could no longer afford it. When he was surrendered to **AGR**, his valley fever titer measured 1:256 (highest possible reading), he weighed only 44 pounds

and was so weak he could not stand or walk without assistance. He was adopted by Liz, our former Health Care Director, via our *Gentle Paws Hospice Adoption* program and remained on daily oral anti-fungal meds. In Spring 2024, **TK** was having seizures. A neurology checkup was done revealing that he had extensive meningitis, which was the likely cause of the seizures, along with severe changes to his skull and osteomyelitis in other bones. Most recently, in early December **TK** began having more unusual seizures and acting abnormally. After an emergency visit to *Thrive Pet* in Scottsdale, **TK** was found to have a large mass growing on the right side of his neck invading the spinal cord. The vet indicated there was no way to remove the mass in his neck, and said the invasion will eventually give **TK** more physical issues even if the mass was not malignant (turns out it was). His prednisone dosage was increased, and for a few weeks he looked good, was eating and happy. Unfortunately, he passed away on January 17. **TK's** expenses for 4th quarter 2025 were **\$7,830**, and total overall expenses for him since early 2022 have been in excess of \$47K. Liz has graciously purchased and donated the cost of **TK's** many meds totaling over \$2K annually.



25-001 Belle is a 3-year-old female Great Pyrenees/Golden mix that was returned to **AGR** in early 2025 when her prior adopter could no longer keep

The Matching Funds ChallengeBy Deb Orwig, *AGR* President

To help raise some end-of-the-year donations, on December 7, 2025, David and Jeannette Morrocco contacted me to offer a *Matching Funds Challenge* of \$5,000 to *AGR* members. Since *Giving Tuesday* had just passed on December 2, I decided to wait until December 15 to issue the *Challenge*; the Morroccos were OK with the delay.



During the next week, it was decided that matching funds raised would go toward paying the medical expenses for getting **25-060 Zazzy's** legs fixed. Here is his predicament: **Zazzy**, an 18-month-old Golden/Great Pyrenees mix, was born with his kneecaps severely dislocated, in fact, they were about 180 degrees offset from where they should be. His

knees were bent and protruded forward; his legs appeared to be locked at the knee. He could barely hobble, taking baby steps with one foot at a time; he could hop like a bunny; he could gallop; but he couldn't walk like a normal dog.



Upon the advice of Dr. Brian Petrovsky at *Arizona Canine Orthopedics & Sports Medicine (ACOSM)* in North Scottsdale, we had CT scans done of **Zazzy's** legs. The scans clearly showed the deformity. After Dr. Petrovsky had had a chance to review the scans, we had a consult with him on December 19 to find out if he felt he could repair the legs; he was confident he could. His plan was to do the weaker right leg first, then do the left leg 3 months later. In the interim between surgeries, **Zazzy** will have about 4 weeks of no-exercise-at-all healing time, then 8-10 weeks, probably twice a week, rehab with a physical therapist. He has been adopted by a family that is committed to his care and rehab. The first surgery will be sometime in February.

Once the *Challenge* was sent out by email and published on the *AGR* Facebook site, donations poured in. When the Morroccos read **Zazzy's** story, they were so touched that they raised the *Challenge* by an additional \$2,000! Our members and supporters more than met the *Challenge*: donations ranging from \$5 to \$2,000 came in, and when all was said and done, 85 people had donated **\$23,453.50!** **Zazzy** will get his legs fixed; he will have weeks of rehab therapy after each surgery; he will have anything else he needs medically for the rest of 2026! Thank you all, and special thanks to Jeannette and David Morrocco!

her. Aside from some basic updated vaccines, parasite testing and a teeth cleaning, the largest expense for **Belle** has been for boarding at one of our local veterinary offices. No one has wanted to adopt this beautiful girl or even foster her, as she is tall and somewhat boisterous, so she could knock over a small child or frail elderly adult. **Belle** is affectionate, gets along well with multiple big dogs, and has been to several recent **AGR** events where the public has been eager to meet her. Thankfully, Connie and Nick are currently fostering her while the Placement Team still searches for an adoptive home for sweet **Belle**. Fourth-quarter expenses for **Belle** were **\$2,205**, and total 2025 expenses were \$6,053, of which \$4,406 of that was just for boarding since her return to Rescue.



25-034 Sol is a 2-year-old male purebred Golden Retriever surrendered with his sister, **25-035 Luna**, by their prior owner due to lack of time for them. Both dogs were severely matted, had ingested rocks, and both dogs were found to have shallow hip sockets. **Sol** and **Luna** both had surgery on June 3rd for foreign body removal of the ingested rocks, and both are placed together and lovingly fostered

by Dewayne and Dori in Sun City West – they intend to adopt them. In November 2025, **Sol** had a needed ear cleaning and abscess drained along with mass/growth removal surgery on an elbow. After a consult with a cardiologist, it has been determined that **Sol's** heart cannot handle the intended hip surgery. So, in late November a specialized wheelchair was ordered for **Sol** from **Pet Ortho Braces**, and he has learned to use it well! Expenses in 4th quarter 2025 for **Sol** have amounted to **\$3,273**.



25-049 Sadie was rescued in August 2025 as a 10-month-old unspayed female English Cream Golden Retriever puppy whose surrendering owner did not have time for her. After initial vetting, she was placed with Joe and Leigh Ann, who intend to adopt her. In early October, **Sadie** was taken to an emergency vet due to vomiting, likely from something she had ingested. Curiously,

it was found that **Sadie's** left kidney was missing and the right one slightly enlarged, but kidney values were good. She was discharged and kept on a bland diet for a few days, with no further episodes of vomiting noted. She had been scheduled to be spayed in October but had to be rescheduled for January due to going into her heat cycle. Fourth-quarter expenses for **Sadie** were **\$3,665**; overall expenses will increase with her upcoming spay in early 2026.

25-053 Callie is an 8-year-old female English Cream Golden Retriever who came into Rescue in late July along with **25-051**

Dolly. They were a bonded pair. Their surrendering owner had personal health issues and could no longer care for them. After initial vetting, **Callie** tested positive for valley fever and was started on a regimen of fluconazole. **Callie** and **Dolly** were both kept in veterinary boarding until Kristie and Andrew were identified as willing to foster the pair of girls and intend to adopt

them. In mid-December, **Callie** was spayed and also had a mammary mass removed. **Callie's** 4th-quarter expenses amounted to **\$2,496**, and total 2025 expenses for her since intake were **\$3,927**.



25-060 Zazzy is a stunning 18-month-old male Golden/Pyrenees mix rescued in mid-October 2025. He was born with knee mobility issues but was not paralyzed and is actually quite ambulatory – he hops like a bunny when moving slowly and can move quickly at a gallop. He was fostered by Deb and Larry, and they got him through his neuter surgery and through various appointments

with veterinary specialists, where it was determined that **Zazzy's** knees could be corrected surgically! Each knee will be done separately in 2026 with at least 3 months of healing and recuperation time in between surgeries. **Zazzy** has been moved to another foster couple, Michelle and Steven, who plan to adopt him and are, fortunately, quite familiar with rehabilitating dogs post-surgery. Expenses so far for **Zazzy** have amounted to **\$4,418**, which will rise significantly in 2026 with the anticipated \$7-8K per knee surgery cost.



25-061 Sunny is an 11-month-old male purebred Golden Retriever whose surrendering owner no longer had time to exercise him; **Sunny** was crated most of the day. Unfortunately, while in boarding **Sunny** was diagnosed with Giardia and required numerous tests and medications to overcome this infection. **Sunny** has since been adopted by Kim and Mark, has

been renamed **Sonny**, and is enjoying his new life with numerous daily walks, cuddling, and obedience training. **Sonny's** expenses in fourth quarter cost **AGR \$2,058**.

25-062 Oro is an estimated 3-year-old male purebred Golden Retriever that was a stray which we rescued from the **MCACC** shelter. He was emaciated and had terrible eye secretions resulting from entropion, a condition where the eyelids roll inward causing hair and lashes to rub against the cornea leading to much irrita-

tion. He received his initial vetting and was brought up-to-date on vaccines and bloodwork, plus had a good grooming. In early October he was evaluated by *EyeCare for Animals* – they



determined eyelid surgery was necessary. The entropion surgery was done in November and currently **Oro** is MUCH improved! He was fostered and subsequently adopted by Kathy, who fell in love with him and has renamed him **Bogey**. His expenses including the eye surgery cost **AGR \$5,583**.

25-063 Bailey is a 10-year-old male purebred Golden Retriever surrendered because his former owner passed away and the family could not keep him. He received updated vaccinations, bloodwork, and grooming. A long-time **AGR** member spoke up for fostering him and hopes to adopt him, as she prefers the senior dogs. In mid-November, **Bailey** required a CT scan to check his thyroid and spleen. Nodules were found, but there were no signs of infection or malignancy. He has also been given some meds for allergy situations. General vet work and the CT scan for **Bailey** have cost **AGR \$3,872** so far.



25-064 Nino is a 2-year-old male Goldendoodle mix who strongly resembles a chocolate-colored Golden. His prior family was moving out of the country and could not take him along. He was already neutered and up-to-date on vaccinations so just required some updated bloodwork. Unfortunately, he tested positive for parvo. He had to remain quarantined in boarding for a few weeks but was able to

receive the very effective parvovirus monoclonal antibody treatment. And in mid-December he was transported to Melody and CJ who plan to adopt him! Fourth-quarter expenses for **Nino** amounted to **\$3,731**.

25-070 Charlie is a 2-year-old male purebred Golden Retriever surrendered by his prior owner, as they had no time for him with a new baby. He is not yet neutered, but just like **Nino**



above, he was up-to-date on vaccinations and needed some updated bloodwork. Also like **Nino**, he unfortunately tested positive for parvo, had to be quarantined in boarding for a few weeks, and was given the parvovirus monoclonal antibody treatment. He has improved and was recently transported to Gina and Ray who plan to adopt him! **Charlie's** expenses in 4th quarter totaled **\$3,411**, which will increase when he is neutered in 2026.





with two amazing humans, Teri and Jeff, but, are you ready for this: five Golden Retriever sisters to keep **Kode** apprised on all the ins and outs of the








